"Proverbs: Principles that Empower"

Almost a thousand years before Christ, the book of Proverbs was written to teach empowering principles of leadership and lifestyles to Jewish young people as the nation of Israel moved from a tribal to imperial government. I once spoke to a Jewish rabbi who told me of the intentionality of their congregation's families to strongly encourage their children to choose high level professions—doctors, lawyers, businessmen, etc. This mindset is in part what accounts for a people group that is less than 1% of the world's population wielding such inordinate influence. It is, if you will, a manifestation of the intent of Proverbs. The study of this book compels people to live life well, to be shaped by the wisdom it offers in areas such as communication, relationships, attitude, managing of situations, work ethic, finances and generosity.

As a primary part of its teaching, Proverbs holds in tension two polar opposites: wisdom and foolishness—knowledge and naiveté—two paths that bring life or death, freedom or bondage. The path that liberates is the very Way of which Jesus will later speak in John 14:6. Indeed, as Proverbs personifies wisdom, we recognize that Jesus is the manifestation of the Wisdom of God empowering us to live well. In all circumstances, in every situation, Jesus is our wisdom, our ability to be fruitful regardless our surroundings. (1 Corinthians 1:30)

"The proverbs of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel: To know wisdom and instruction...(1:1-2). The word "Proverb" refers to a short value statement intended to form our thinking and our lifestyles. Similar to the Confucian *Analects* which were designed to shape Chinese culture from "womb to tomb," so Proverbs is a collection of wisdom sayings that function as a rule of life, a rule or standard by which we live. The Greek and Latin root for the word "rule" is where we get our word "trellis." In the 6th century the "Rule of Saint Benedict" became a foundational approach for living the Christian life. In this context a rule is not some dry, legal ordinance we must keep. Rather, a rule is a "trellis," a structure or center around which our life is lived. Like vines, our lives express individual creativity and can move in different directions, but within the boundaries of the trellis, the rule. Our "trellis" is the Word and Spirit—it is "Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1 Corinthians 1:24).

Wisdom is a Hebrew word that means "the skillful use of knowledge." So wisdom of Proverbs equips us to use information well. We might say that knowledge is input; wisdom is output. Knowledge is information; wisdom is formation. In Matthew 7 Jesus compared the wise man with the foolish man. The difference was hearing and "doing" vs. just hearing. The wise man had output. He put into action the knowledge or information he had heard.

A person can have a large vocabulary, but still not be able to communicate. Someone may have a desire to connect with others relationally but have no idea how to go about it. There was a man I once knew who was quite knowledgeable, but never knew when to be quiet. People avoided being cornered by him. He talked about himself all the time. He never learned the art of developing relationships by showing interest in others, by asking questions about their lives. He had knowledge but not wisdom. He didn't know how to skillfully use the information he had. A young person may have mastery over mathematics and excel in the sciences. That's knowledge. But that same student might go off to college with a new credit card and rack up thousands of dollars in unnecessary expenses, debt that he/she will have to pay off for years to come. That's a lack of wisdom. Another student may have average academic ability but superior wisdom. He/she will tend to outperform in the whole of life the one who is superior in knowledge. You see, Wisdom is a person—Jesus. And Jesus maximizes the gifts he places in us.


OUR SIGN OUT FRONT
